**WHEN I BECAME PRESIDENT** of the board of MCO in spring of 2021, I didn't know that my tenure would be so eventful! I've been at the helm of the MCO during a dynamic period of transition—a new era, as we entered our second half century, moved into a new home, embraced a post-pandemic world, and welcomed a new executive director.

In the MCO's 50th Anniversary year, we boldly planned a hybrid season, with extra in-person and online concerts, presented our first ever opera, and hosted a 50th Anniversary celebration for subscribers and supporters! Our outreach and audience engagement efforts have grown appreciably, as we re-double our commitment to create community through music not just in the performance hall, but for all Manitobans.

The board and staff of this resilient organization have risen to every challenge, as this was especially apparent in 2022/23. Every time a window closed, we found a door to open to keep delivering on our mission to create and perform music for Manitobans. A heartfelt thank you to the staff for their dedication and incredible work over the past year. They have kept the organization active and energized and have given their tremendous talents and energy to make the 2022/23 season possible under challenging circumstances.

I also want to thank my fellow board members for their insightful guidance and thoughtful care in providing governance and strategic thinking, to preserve the legacy of the MCO for future audiences. And finally, a thank you to our patrons, donors, sponsors, and funders, for their commitment to the mission of the MCO, for creating community around the shared experience of music.

While my tenure as Board President ends this November, there are many highlights to look back on. These include the warm greeting I exchanged with so many audience and community members at concerts, signing the Winnipeg Indigenous Accord, and receiving the Mayor's Community Service Award on behalf of the MCO in the spring of 2023.

I'm thrilled to remain on the MCO's Executive Committee and to continue sharing the music and magic during our spectacular first season of the MCO's next 50 years!

The return to performance halls, the return of the audience, the return of live music experiences was revelatory. In 2022/23, the MCO returned in a big way, ushering audiences back to the performance hall, striking out into new venues and experimenting with new formats, and welcoming back old friends and new. The orchestra had tremendous artistic successes.

In the community, the MCO continued to grow its education and audience engagement activities with another successful tour of workshops and concerts in northern Manitoba communities. We connected with newcomers, senior groups, and social service agencies, and invited them to share in the uplifting experience of live music. We ventured into libraries, museums, parks, farmers' markets, and other community spaces with free and fun musical offerings. We enriched our relationships with schools and students, with both in-school presentations and sold-out matinee performances. We provided life affirming performances in healthcare centres.

It's been a delight to look back at the stories and statistics of 2022/23 and I'm thrilled to have joined this cherished organization as we look to the future. I've felt welcomed by the board, staff, musicians, and supporters of the MCO. I feel strongly that this organization is driven by joyfulness, innovation, and a desire to make an impact.

I look forward to exploring all of this with you and seeing you at a concert or event very soon.

**THE 22/23 MCO SEASON** was one of return in many ways. The orchestra's membership of incredible musicians has a unique personality, jubilant and dynamic, and a spirit of striving for transcendent experiences. We hear this sentiment again and again from our guest artists, our visiting conductors, and our orchestral musicians. The MCO is greater than the sum of its parts. It is something truly special.

Moving forward from the MCO's 50th Anniversary season, at the end of which we welcomed our intrepid new Executive Director, Sean McManus, we are energized to look ahead to the next 50 years, envisioning the orchestra's future. We're giving voice to diverse perspectives, putting women on the podium and centre stage, and using music as a means towards reconciliation, growth, and reflection. The MCO strives to do all this and more while remaining true to its purpose: to share the immense joy of music with others. What could be a better investment in our future?

***Equinox***  
**March 22nd at the Winnipeg Art Gallery**

Kerey Harper began making music in high school by recording rain, stones, and natural sounds in his northern First Nations community of St. Theresa's Point. At this concert, held at the Winnipeg Art Gallery, he joined four brilliant composers—Chris Byman, Kris Wachniak, Corie-Rose Soumah, and international sensation Nahre Sol—in creating a program of brand-new music, with music advisor Larry Strachan. Marking the equinox, this concert transported audiences' imaginations to Canadian landscapes budding and opening themselves up to spring.

**Cris Derksen and Aisslinn Nosky**  
**April 12th at Crescent Arts Centre**

At this excellent matinee and evening concert, cellist-composer Cris Derksen weaved her classical background and Indigenous ancestry with new-school electronics to present staggering new music for cello and orchestra. Under the baton of conductor Aisslinn Nosky, and joined by hoop dancer Shanley Spence, Cris riveted school groups and MCO audiences.

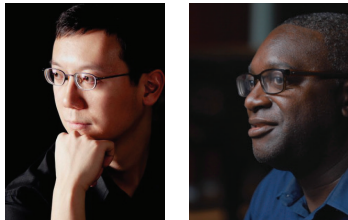
**James Ehnes and Larry Strachan**

What more needs to be said about James? The Brandon-native and 2X GRAMMY-winning violinist ranks among the top 10 living violinists in the world and has been performing with the MCO since his early days. Audiences were equally floored by an irresistible new work by local musician Larry Strachan that had the orchestra and conductor Anne Manson moving to its infectious rhythms as much as those watching.

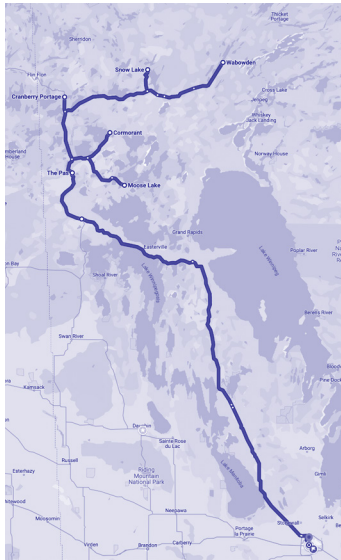

**UNIQUE & INNOVATIVE EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMMING** and facilitating meaningful experiences with music was a key goal for the MCO in 2022/23, fostering life-long learning and engagement with the arts. With ever-evolving programming to meet the needs of students, educators, families, and community leaders, the 22/23 season included customized workshops and performances for children and youth, professional development and support for teachers and pre-professional musicians, and learning resources that encouraged meaningful connection, introduced musical concepts, and promoted active learning.

### **AFTERNOONS WITH THE MCO**

Schools were eager to reconnect with the MCO this season, with nearly 600 children, youth and staff attending our matinees! New pre-matinee workshops were introduced at 5 schools, reaching more than 250 student and staff participants.

### **SPRING OUTREACH TOUR**

May 28 to June 2, 2023 / Snow Lake, Cranberry Portage, Wabowden, The Pas, Moose Lake, Cormorant

Our Spring 2023 outreach tour took us to communities in the Frontier School Division where the popular fiddle programs are gradually rebuilding post-pandemic. At each school, we scheduled workshops with local students and performed together in a community concert. It was a wonderful privilege to collaborate with long-time FSD fiddle instructor Cameron Baggins, and William Nielsen, a first year fiddle teacher. This collaborative, comprehensive, and meaningful education project created a sense of excitement and anticipation for reintroducing these experiences for students and communities.

**COMMUNITY IS AT THE HEART** of the MCO, and our 2022/23 Community Engagement programming ensured that more Manitobans had access to live musical performances. The MCO's outreach ensemble performed throughout the year at a wide variety of community spaces including farmers' markets, museums, and social service organizations. Through calls, meetings, and social media, we were grateful for the individual and community partnerships that allow us to listen, support and engage with inspiring people across the province.

## SEVEN OAKS HOUSE MUSEUM

In 2022, the MCO outreach ensemble Fiddlers on the Loose, was the guest artist for a Labour Day weekend celebration at Seven Oaks House Museum. The event had over 200 attendees who came out to enjoy the music, and visit the museum and surrounding park. Supported by the Music Performance Trust Fund, the event is the start of an exciting partnership.

## ARTISTS IN HEALTHCARE MANITOBA

The MCO expanded our partnership with Artists In Healthcare Manitoba in 2022/23, to bring 35 uplifting concerts to seniors in long-term care, patients and residents in hospitals and hospices, mental health patients across thirteen Manitoba healthcare organizations, and Indigenous residents of Selkirk Mental Health Centre. Funding for patient support arts programming is often outside the scope of healthcare funding, and the MCO and AIHM are honoured to help fill this need with support from Johnston Group, The Winnipeg Foundation, and others. Benefits of this program will extend beyond healthcare, helping to keep Manitoba musicians performing and connected to local audiences.

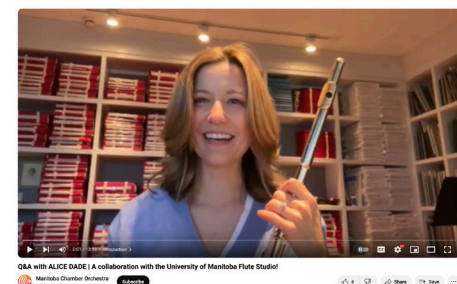

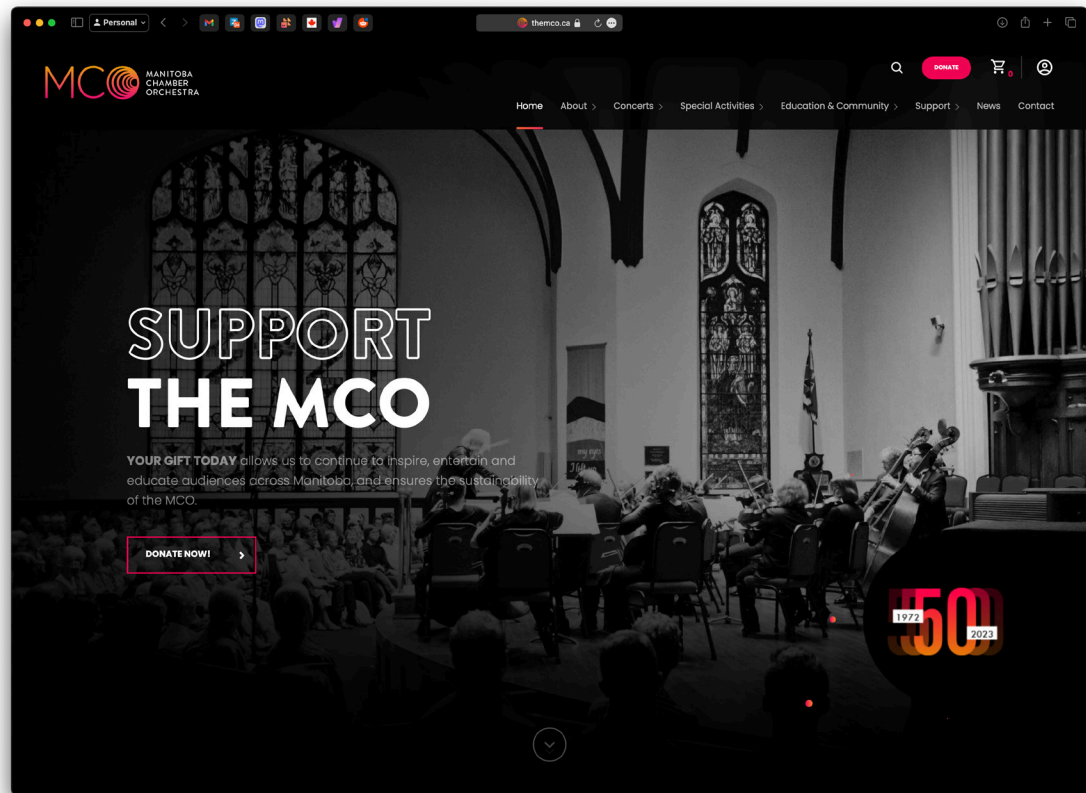

### **MCO ENDOWMENT FUND**

The MCO received two outstanding gifts to our Endowment Fund that will support the organization for decades to come. In 2022, Roger Groening donated \$30,000 in memoriam of his father, long-time MCO patron, Edd Groening. In 2023, former MCO Board President, Wesley Stevens and Virginia Stevens donated \$30,000. With matching funds, the two donations contributed nearly \$100,000 to a future of uplifting musical experiences. The MCO Endowment Fund, held with the Winnipeg Foundation, is currently valued at \$2,381,834.

### **CANDLELIGHT FUNDRAISER**

The MCO hosted an elegant Candlelight Fundraiser on November 8th, 2022. Hosted by conductor Scott Yoo and set at historic Fort Gibraltar, Candlelight was an intimate evening of exquisite music exploration, delicious hors d'oeuvres, and delightful conversation. Yoo treated nearly 120 guests to a fascinating discussion of Bartók's Music for Strings, Percussion & Celesta, alongside an ensemble of MCO musicians illustrating selections from the piece.

### **PRIVATE GIVING**

Members of the MCO community continue to give generously to support community building through music including concerts, school matinees, workshops, tours to northern Manitoba, and free community performances. Private donations make a direct impact in our community and are integral to the work of the MCO. In 22/23, private donors contributed \$311,508.

### **VINYL VAULT**

After a hiatus, Vinyl Vault returned with in-person sales. Once a month, our 15,000 strong record collection opens its doors to collectors. With most records on sale for no more than \$3, the Vault is not only one of Winnipeg's biggest record sales of its kind, it's also one of the most affordable. Our 22/23 Vinyl Vault was an important fundraiser for the MCO, bringing in nearly \$18,000 in sales. The contributions of our Vinyl Vault volunteers, led by Alice MacKenzie, are truly outstanding in making these sales possible.

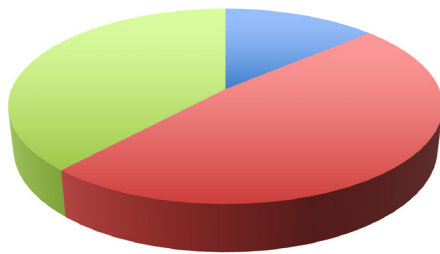

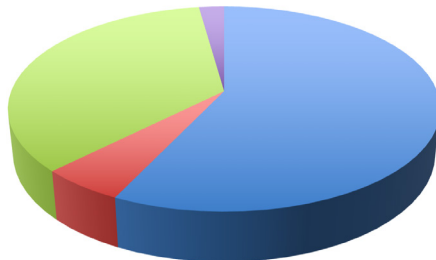
