### WOMEN IN THE SPOTLIGHT

The 2023-24 season celebrated the remarkable artistry of women in music, featuring outstanding soloists and conductors. Soprano Lara Secord-Haid made her MCO debut, delivering a poignant performance of Sid Robinovitch's newly orchestrated Canciones Sefardies. Venezuelan soprano Maria Brea graced the Winnipeg stage with a stunning program that included the Canadian premiere of Odaline de la Martinez's Four Afro-Cuban Poems. Principal cellist Desiree Abbey stepped into the soloist spotlight, premiering a cello concerto composed for her by Jamaican-Canadian composer Ted Runcie. Canadian violist Sarah McElravy closed the season with a profound interpretation of Shostakovich's Viola Sonata, arranged for viola and strings. On the podium, conductors Tania Miller and Jeri Lynne Johnson led the orchestra with distinction, underscoring the MCO's commitment to showcasing diverse talents in music performance.

#### MATINEE PERFORMANCES

Making concert performances accessible to all, the MCO continued its matinee offerings this season. Afternoon performances featured Dinuk Wijeratne and Shawn Mativetsky performing orchestral works featuring tabla, pianist Jeneba Kanneh-Mason, who enchanted audiences with Mozart's Piano Concerto No. 23, and violist Sarah McElravy, whose

rendition of Shostakovich's Viola Sonata left a lasting impression. These matinees provided enriching musical experiences for a broader audience, including school groups and seniors.

### COMMISSIONS, PREMIERES AND REPRISES

Demonstrating our dedication to contemporary composers, the MCO presented several significant premieres and reprises this season. Ariel Barnes delivered an emotionally charged performance of Glenn Buhr's Cello Concerto No. 2, while Dinuk Wijeratne's Gajaga Vannama, commissioned by the MCO in 2019, was reprised to great acclaim, blending Sri Lankan rhythms with classical elements. Desiree Abbey performed the world premiere of Ted Runcie's Cello Concerto, a piece written specifically for her. The season also featured the Canadian premiere of Jessie Montgomery's Rounds, the Grammy Award-winning work for Best Contemporary Classical Composition, and a thrilling performance of Matthias McIntire's evocative Bluegreen Ecstatic Grey. We were honoured to have composers present at six of this season's concerts. The MCO remains steadfast in its commitment to fostering innovation and creativity in Canadian concert music.

Developed as a collaboration with artists Sage Stoyanowski and Victoria Sparks, these presentations invited children to explore a wide range of fun percussion instruments, silly sounds, rhythms, and a delightful storybook brought to life with melodies and sound effects.

### MCO IN SCHOOLS

Throughout the school year, we visited schools and daycares for workshops, collaborative projects, and concerts. In Fall 2023, we were invited back to Hugh John Macdonald School and collaborated with music teacher Neil Watson and students in The Bridge Program to performing jazz standards. During the frigid weeks of February, schools across the city were treated to unforgettable performances by the MCO's Fiddlers on the Loose.

We had another successful outreach tour in 2023-24, with visits to schools and Aboriginal Head Start Programs in Selkirk, Grand Marais, Hollow Water First Nation, Black River First Nation, Powerview, and Beausejour. This tour coincided with the Canada-wide Music Education day of celebration and advocacy, Music Monday, as well as Manitoba Music Month. Our partnerships with school divisions including Frontier School Division continue to evolve and strengthen with each tour and cultural celebration.

**OVER THE 2023-24 SEASON,** the MCO experienced transformative growth in our community impact and collaborations. New small-group programs and classes for adults and seniors were introduced to great success, celebrating the joys of life-long learning with members of our community, while carefully considering the needs of learners of all ages and experiences. We met the community where they were at, joyfully delivering classes and workshops in community spaces and seniors' residences. We then hosted those participants at MCO concerts and rehearsals, creating opportunities to foster relationships and strengthen community connections. While maintaining and honouring our existing community and education partnerships, we developed new relationships and initiatives with Thrive Community Support Circle and Fort Garry Women's Resource Centre, and delivered a popular year-long course at McNally Robinson's Community Classroom.



### EXPANDING OUR IMPACT, COMMITMENT AND ADVOCACY

Beyond the concert hall and classroom, we remained committed to uplifting and celebrating our extensive network of community partners and colleagues through consistent engagement and participation at events, concerts, and conferences. Building on MCO's growing presence and impact over recent seasons, we proudly joined the Association of Music Administrators of Manitoba (AMAM), enabling us to amplify our voice, impact, and advocacy within a collaborative group of inspiring provincial leaders, stakeholders, and policy makers dedicated to advancing music education.

### **COMMUNITY CONCERTS**

We kicked off the 2023-24 season with local community performances, including our second annual summer concert at Winnipeg's historic Seven Oaks House Museum. Hundreds of community members came out to enjoy fabulous music from the MCO's Fiddlers on the Loose and a slice of cake to celebrate the museum's 65th anniversary. We presented a popular series of MCO Holiday Concerts thanks to partnerships with The Forks, Gas Station Arts Centre, and Downtown Biz. Through accessible, welcoming, and free live music experiences and collaborating with local partners, we worked to reduce the barriers to accessing the arts. We were able to reach more diverse audiences, families, older adults, and other community members, many of whom experienced the MCO for the first time. We recognized the importance of ensuring this first encounter was joyful, inclusive, and memorable, leaving a lasting impression and fostering a connection to the arts. In 2023-24, we gratefully received support from the Music Performance Trust Fund for MCO Community Concerts.


